WHAT IS IT?

DIGITAL PRESERVATION: a comprehensive set of managed activities that are necessary to provided continued access to digital objects, beyond the limits of media failure or technological change. > At minimum it should include bit-level preservation.

GOAL

 The goal of digital preservation/curation is to maintain the ability to store, access, retrieve, render and use digital material in the face of rapidly changing technological and organizational infrastructures, while maintaining the authenticity of the artifact.


