- Americans with Disabilities Act Title 2
- Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)
 - Version 2.2 is current, Version 3 is in draft stage

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)

Design accessibility from the beginning!



- Headings
- Alt-text
- Contrast
Structure and navigation

Screen readers can navigate content by headings and can skip to links

Use descriptive hyperlink text (**not** "click here")

Screen readers rely on structures to help with reading order. Formatting content visually rarely works.

Test content manually.



Document accessibility

- Font: Sans Serif is easier to read, not this
- Don't rely on only color to convey significance.
- Image 1: Labels for a Trello board with patterns
- Image 2: Traffic lights simulating spectrums of color blindness https://eye-able.com/e n/color-blindness-andcolor-deficiency/

Testing

- <u>DLF Accessibility Auditing</u>
 <u>Shortlist</u>
- Try built-in TalkBack, VoiceOver, and common paid programs like JAWS
- Dark mode
- High Contrast mode
- Engage and compensate disabled people to help with UX studies

Passing an accessibility automated test doesn't mean it's actually *usable!*

Captions



Problems with scanned documents

Scanning/PDF as an image locks the screen reader out!

OCRing image prone to errors and needs structure remediation
