1. Welcome

a. President Melissa Dalton called the meeting to order at 11:05 AM.

2. Minutes

- a. Vote to approve minutes from the March 1 meeting.
 - i. Dalton motioned to approve minutes from the March 1 meeting. Council Member Jim DaMico seconds, motion carries.

3. Committee Reports

- a. Treasurer
 - i. Brittany Hayes Not a lot of financial transactions this month.
- b. Membership & Awards (MAC)
 - i. Jennifer Long Morehart We're continuing the transition from two committees into one, increasing communication, and cross-training between the Co-Chairs. Also transitioning into more in-person meetings. We've had 100% committee participation, so everyone has actively contributed in some way during 2023-2024. We have 131 members. The Membership Benefit Statement is attached to our committee report. We've completed the 2024 membership drive, so all 3 email blasts from the Ohio History Connection went out. There's interest in improving the Membership Directory. Since a password protected directory isn't possible, we're wondering about a PDF only directory. Let us know if anyone as any ideas or technical expertise.
 - ii. Helen Conger Selected two Merit Award, a New Professional Award, and one Student Scholarship Award winner as well as the Ohio Preservation Council winner. The committee could not come to a final decision on the second professional award. Could we use the second New Professional Award for a third Student Award? We applied the new rubric.
 - 1. DaMico What does the new rubric look like? If someone is applying and getting a low rubric score, maybe they're just so new to the profession.
 - 2. Conger We're going to give an update on the rubric soon. It was just developed 2023-2024 and is based on criteria for the award as advertised on the SOA website.
 - 3. Dalton There's not a minimum about of points you're supposed to have on the rubric to qualify for an award.
 - 4. Amy Rohmiller Does the New Professional Scholarship announcement say we give up to two scholarships? Or does it say we give two?
 - 5. Conger The website says "The Society of Ohio Archivists is pleased to announce five scholarships available to students (2 awards), and new archival professionals (2 awards) with three years or less experience in the workplace. The final scholarship category, the Ohio Preservation Council Student/New Professional Scholarship, is available to either students or new professionals."
 - 6. Council Member Kristen Newby If we have the money to give this year, we should do that. We shouldn't take score into account for the new professional who wants to join SOA and become more well-rounded.

- 7. Rohmiller We've shifted around scholarships in the past, but that was because of a lack of applicants.
- 8. Dalton Sounds like a majority of people are in agreement that we should go ahead and give the scholarships as stated.

c. Marketing & Communication (MCC)

i. Jane Wildermuth - Five new blog posts. In the last 30 days we've had 5,730 page views, which is an increase of 279%. We're getting the word out about the conference. We added four new listserv members. I will work on the SOA LinkedIn page soon.

d. Nominating (NC)

i. Rohmiller - It's election season! Elections will open the day the Spring newsletter goes out and close at noon on the Friday before the Spring conference in-person day. Results will be announced at the business meeting. Only SOA members will be able to vote.

e. Newsletter

i. Jessica Heys - The Spring issue is in the works.

f. Educational Programming (EPC)

- i. Michelle Sweetser We finalized program schedule. Thanks to MCC and Betsy for getting the word out. We encourage everyone to promote conference registration. We're working with the plenary speaker to book housing. Changes to the program include a speaker withdraw and a speaker likely recording their session due to health challenges. We're feeling good about Capital University.
- ii. Sara Mouch We're reaching out to another speaker for a full slate.
- iii. Betsy Hedler 25 registered so far. 16 full conference registrations and 9 virtual.

g. Advocacy & Outreach (AOC)

- i. Jim McKinnon We sent out a call for poster photo submissions. We reached out to Ohio special Olympics groups to ask for submissions. We're planning a special online event to happen in October to coincide with the poster reveal.
- ii. Collette McDonough So far, we have 17 submissions from different organizations. Most are from special Olympics groups.

the October meeting. Could some members of EPC assist in choosing sessions for the Fall? We don't receive any financial compensation for the Fall meeting. What is the organizational benefit? We're about people, but there's not that financial advantage. When people propose sessions for the Spring meeting, we might ask them about their interests in participating in OLHA to boost Fall sessions.
